The Columbia County Commissioners met on the above date at 2:00 PM in the Commissioners' Conference Room at the First Street Annex for the transaction of routine business. In attendance were Commissioners Young, Ridgway, Solicitor McDonald, Chief Clerk Witchey, Register Recorder Lupini, Jean Lapinski, Jen Long, Fred Hunsinger, and Marcie Strachko.

A motion was made by Ridgway and seconded by Young to approve the minutes of the last meeting. The motion was unanimously passed.

There was a work session at 10:00 AM in the Commissioners Conference Room at the First Street Annex for the transaction of routine business. In attendance were Commissioners Ridgway, Solicitor McDonald, Chief Clerk Witchey, Tim Murphy, Marcie Strachko, Jean Lapinski, Eric Stahley, Wade Mays, Jen Long, Fred Hunsinger, Bob Aungst, and April Miller. The work session began with Wade Mays asking if an Eagle Scout project can be done on the voting booths, the Commissioners said for the Eagle Scout to write up his plan and present it so the Commissioners can review. Glenda then reviewed the close out documents with EDDA, they current are holding \$1,500,000 which is the 10% retainage of their portion of the project. The closeout extension was granted the new date is April 17, 2017. Borton Lawson agreement regarding the wetlands monitoring for 5 years will be \$37,000 which will be paid out of the remaining funds. Greenman Peterson had incurred additional cost associated with the punch list items that will be extending into the spring, the additional work and warranty work will cause an additional \$11,000 to GPI. They will also have a new agreement with the Authority with a not to exceed \$28,000 which includes the previous \$11,000, which both Bill and Glenda say is reasonable.
